These businesses are vitally important and we've if we want to retain a private enterprise free market system, we've got to actively encourage and support enterprise.

One of the guy wires on our mast on the roof of the studio broke, and I got up there to have a look at it, and they were all rotten, so. Oh, dear. That looks like a mast going to fall over. That wasn't too good. So I had to ring around. And Jason Sikes from Southwest Electrical and Communications came to our rescue, borrowed a machine at elevated work platform and got up there and has replaced all the guys. So a big shout out.
